Our Mission

The Executive Degrees in International Organizations Management are unique programs designed for professionals working in International Non-Profit Organizations (NPOs) of the Geneva area willing to develop their technical, leadership and managerial skills and extend their knowledge of the socio-economic and political context in which they work.

The Certificate of Advanced Studies (CAS) and the Diploma of Advanced Studies (DAS) offer a multidisciplinary curriculum taught by an international faculty from leading universities around the world and practitioners from IOs and NGOs. It exposes participants to the latest theoretical and applied knowledge combined with state-of-the-art teaching methodologies.

Located in the heart of Geneva, in proximity to the United Nations and other prestigious international institutions, the University of Geneva's CAS & DAS in International Organizations Management empower a new generation of change makers who will take on greater responsibility in their own organizations.

Objectives

- Master advanced management skills and practices commonly used in intergovernmental, public and non-profit organizations
- Analyze fundamental concepts of change management in complex organizational settings
- Explore risk analysis and decision-making mechanisms
- Strengthen leadership and team management skills and learn to apply intercultural negotiation techniques
- Gain project management skills and set up innovative solutions
- Develop a professional network to share knowledge and expertise around the world

Audience

Participants come from many different countries, from diverse professional backgrounds (IOs, NGOs, NPOs, or public and private sector) and have an average of seven years of work experience. The program counts over 250 alumni working in diverse sectors in international development (IOs, NGOs), social entreprise, private sector and government.

- CAS: 1 to 2 years | 6 modules | 18 ECTS
- DAS: 1 to 2 years | 10 modules | 30 ECTS
