Duke University Intensive Course Available for UNIGE Students in the following tracks:

Humanitarian Crisis, Refugees and Human Rights

The course provides participants with a thorough introduction to international humanitarian assistance, human rights, and human security. It explores how the international community can better respond to humanitarian crises such as the influx of refugees in Europe, HIV-AIDS in Africa, or ongoing civil conflict in countries such as Sudan. It examines the importance of both cooperation and collaboration on a global scale by organizations.

The Environment, Energy and the Economy


