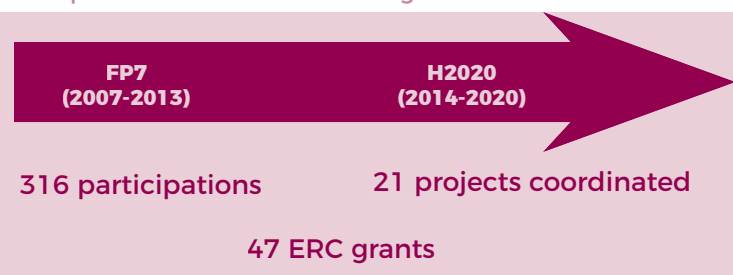

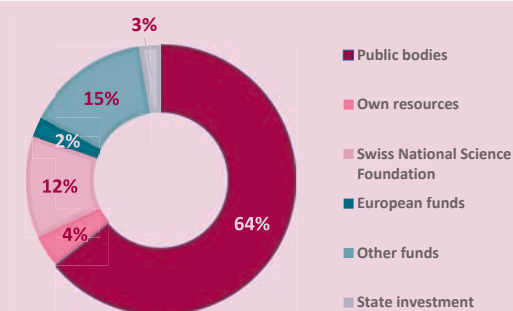

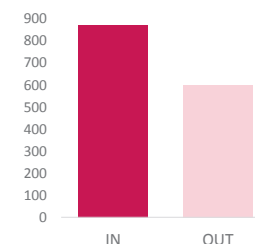

THE UNIVERSITY OF GENEVA

The University of Geneva (UNIGE), founded in 1559 by Jean Calvin, is recognized today as one of the top 100 universities in the world. With 16,530 students from more than 150 countries, UNIGE is the third largest university in Switzerland.

Our University has been cultivating excellence for more than 450 years. We encourage interdisciplinarity both in teaching and research, which has garnered us worldwide recognition. Located in the heart of international Geneva, UNIGE has built a vast network with numerous international organizations including the United Nations (UN) and the European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN).

FACULTIES AND INTERDISCIPLINARY CENTRES

The University of Geneva offers a wide array of high-level programs through nine Faculties (Science, Medicine, Humanities, Social Sciences, Economics and Management, Law, Theology, Psychology and Educational Sciences, Translation and Interpreting) and fourteen interdisciplinary Centres and programs (Global Studies Institute, Computer Science Centre, University Teacher Training Institute, etc.). The University also hosts several National Centres of Competence in Research (NCCRs).

PROGRAMS

More than 500 programs are on offer at UNIGE, including 129 Bachelor's and Master's degree programs, 82 doctoral programs, and more than 300 continuing education programs. Disciplines covered include Neuroscience, Environmental Sciences, Finance, Bioethics, Human Rights, International Relations, Genetics, Affective Sciences, History, and many more.

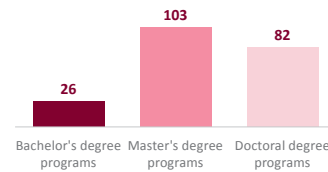

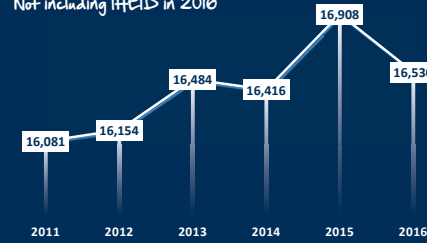

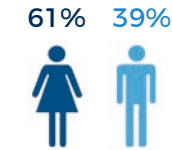

Students by Faculties and Interdisciplinary Centres

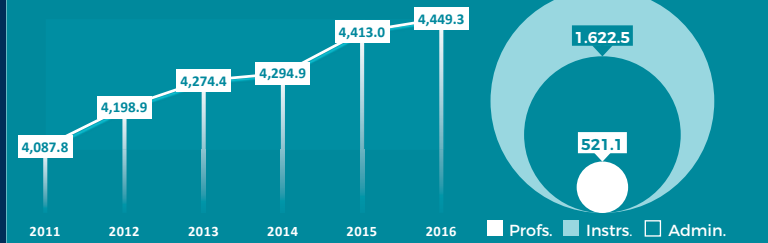

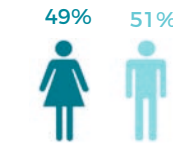

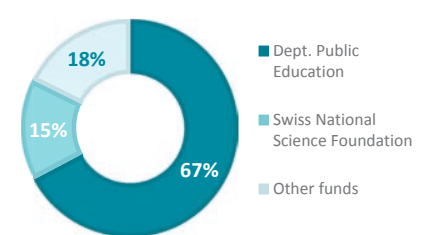
