WHAT ARE RESEARCH DATA?


- ✓ persistent identifier
- ✓ enriched metadata
- Searchable and findable online




- retrievable using standard communication protocols
- possibility to define access rights
- → in a repository that ensures long-term preservation



- ✓ standard formats
- ✓ controlled vocabulary to describe data





- ✓ well-described & documented (e.g. in a README file)
- clear conditions to cite and reuse data (e.g. CC licenses)
- → allow data to be correctly interpreted and reused


How to find a repository?



FUNDERS' REQUIREMENTS



FAIR repository

Has to be maintained by a non-profit organisation if you want financial support for uploading/preparing your data



FAIR principles



IN A NUTSHELL

Ideally, your repository should:

- ✓ be conform to the FAIR data principles
- ✓ be maintained by a non-profit organisation
- √ fits your needs
- ✓ ensures optimal accessibility and visibility to your data
- ✓ comply with your funders' requirements
