Claire Balleys is a researcher in Sociology of Youth and Digital practices. Professor at the University of Applied Sciences and Arts Western Switzerland, her teaching and research interests include the sociology of adolescence, teenage socialization processes and cultural practices. Her area of expertise focuses on the construction of the self through adolescence, the acquisition of autonomy, trust and self-confidence in a connected environment.

Daphné Bavelier is an internationally recognized expert on how humans learn. In particular, she studies how the brain adapts to changes in experience, either by nature - for example, deafness - or by training - for example, playing video games. Her lab established that playing fast-paced, action-packed entertainment video games typically thought to be mind-numbing actually benefits several aspects of behavior. Exploiting this counter-intuitive finding, the Cognitive Neuroscience research team she now heads at the University of Geneva, Switzerland investigates how new media, such as video games, can be leveraged to foster learning and brain plasticity.

Warren Buckleitner is a professor and educational researcher with a specialization in the design of children's interactive media. He teaches interactive design at The College of New Jersey, and is the Editor of Children's Technology review. He covered children's technology for the New York Times for over a decade and is the founder of the Dust or Magic Institute, an annual meeting of leading designers, researchers, and reviewers who gather to share examples of best practice in children's digital media. He is the coordinator of two juried annual awards: the Bologna Ragazzi Digital award given at the Bologna Children's Book Fair, and the KAPi Awards at CES. In 2017, he was named a Senior Fellow at the Fred Rogers Center.

Rahel Heeg teaches and conducts research at the University of Applied Sciences and Arts Northwestern Switzerland at the Institute for Studies in Children and Youth Services.

As an author, she has published a guide for parents and a book series for young children with the aim to enhance media literacy skills at a very young age (www.ulladieeule.ch). Currently she is working as a lecturer at the University for Teacher Education in Zurich (PHZH) and is also running her own company that provides media advice to different agents of socialization. As a mother of three young children (4-10 y.), she always has two different angles to look at media including their associated risks and advantages.

Olga Khazova is affiliated with the Moscow School for Social & Economic Sciences and the “Higher School of Economics”. She has a Ph.D. from the Institute of State & Law within the Russian Academy of Sciences and LL.M. from Cornell University Law School (USA). Her professional interests are in the field of international family law and child law. She is Vice-President of the International Society of Family Law (ISFL). In 2013, she was elected as a member of the UN CRC and re-elected for a second term in 2016. In 2017-18, she served as Vice-Chair of the Committee.



Philip D. Jaffé is a full professor and director of The Centre for Children's Rights Studies (CIDE). He is also jointly responsible with Prof. Michelle Cottier for the Children and Youth Politics section of the Swiss Centre of Expertise in Human Rights (SCHR). For many years now his area of academic and professional activities have focused on the protection of the child, in particular concerning sexual abuse and the participation of the child in the civil and criminal legal system.

Gerison Lansdown is an international advocate for children's rights. She has been published widely, and contributed to several general comments for the Committee on the Rights of the Child, including currently on rights in the digital environment. She is an adjunct professor at Carleton University Canada, has Honorary Doctorates from the Open University, Carleton University, University of Central Lancashire and University of East London, and is on the OSF Early Years Advisory Board, and the editorial advisory board of the Canadian Journal of Children's Rights.



Sonia Livingstone DPhil (Oxon), FBA, FBPS, FAcSS, FRSA, OBE is a professor in the [Department of Media and Communications](#) at the London School of Economics and Political Science. She has published 20 books including "[The Class: Living and Learning in the Digital Age](#)." She directs the projects "[Children's Data and Privacy Online](#)," "[Global Kids Online](#)" (with UNICEF) and "[Parenting for a Digital Future](#)", and is Deputy Director of the UKRI-funded "[Nurture Network](#)." Since founding the 33 country [EU Kids Online](#) network, Sonia has advised the UK government, European Commission, European Parliament, Council of Europe, OECD and UNICEF. 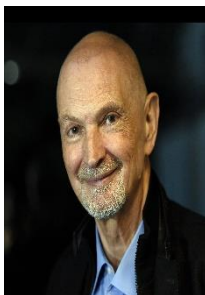

Through his activities as a former topic leader in a large Swiss NGO and as a member of the Federal Commission for Children and Youth Affairs EKKJ, he has been and still is in constant contact with the younger generation. In his exchanges with them, he has learned that knowledge is the best protective message we can offer our children. To achieve this, we adults in particular must become competent. In dealing with digital media and in involving children and young people in social processes and in measures affecting children.



Stacey Steinberg is the supervising attorney for the Gator TeamChild Juvenile Law Clinic and an associate director for the Center on Children and Families at the University of Florida College of Law where she represents abused and neglected children in complex court proceedings. Steinberg's academic research explores the intersection of a parent's right to share online and a child's interest in privacy. Steinberg's work has been published by many academic journals and news media publications including JAMA Pediatrics, The Emory Law Journal, The New York Times, and The Washington Post. She has offered commentary to journalists at many international news outlets including CNN, NPR, The Atlantic, CBS News, USA Today, BBC, and Consumer Reports. Prior to joining the law faculty, Steinberg served as a felony prosecutor handling crimes involving child abuse, intimate partner violence, sexual battery, and child pornography. Her book, [Growing Up Shared: How Parents Can Share Smarter on Social Media and What You Can Do to Keep Your Family Safe in a No Privacy World](#), will be published by sourcebooks in August 2020.
