Job Offers: Two PhD Positions (SNSF)

The two PhD positions are part of the research funded by the Swiss National Science Foundation (SNSF) - Interdisciplinary Research Committee: "Exploring the way to and from school with children: an interdisciplinary approach of children's experiences of the third place". This interdisciplinary and collaborative research project aims to study the children's way to and from school experiential, psycho-social, educational and creative dimensions. Children's experiences, conceptions and perceptions will be analysed in order to better understand interconnections and transfers between the two main educational spheres of children: their home and school. The analysis of these interrelated dimensions is also part of the wider context of interactions between schools and families/parents, local communities and educational policies. In a comparative and transdisciplinary perspective, the areas of inquiry will be spread over several cantons and linguistic regions: Valais, Graubünden and Ticino.

The successful candidates will carry out a PhD thesis at the Faculty of Psychology and Educational Sciences of the University of Geneva (UNIGE). They will work as part of an inter-institutional, interdisciplinary and plurilingual team (Valais University of Teacher Education (HEP-VS) and Center for Children's Rights Studies, University of Geneva (UNIGE). They will be under the responsibility of Zoe Moody (Prof. HEP-VS), Philip Jaffé (Prof. UNIGE) and Frédéric Darbellay (Prof. UNIGE). The research team anchors its interdisciplinary work in the academic field of children's rights, mobilizing the contributions of educational sciences, psychology and childhood studies in particular.
