The Interaction between the EU's External Environmental Policy and International Environmental Law

Abstract

The European Union (EU) is well known for its prolific environmental law-making activities and for the multi-faceted environmental dimensions of its external relations. It is also increasingly establishing explicit linkages between its internal environmental regulation and its external environmental or environment-related action in an ambitious effort to support environmental multilateralism. This accords with the EU's own constitutional objectives: helping develop international measures to preserve and improve the quality of the environment and the sustainable management of global natural resources; promoting an international system based on stronger multilateral environmental cooperation and good global environmental governance, with a view to promoting multilateral solutions to common environmental problems, in particular in the framework of the United Nations.

Dr Morgera will discuss the evolution of these efforts and their relevance from an international law perspective. While the EU's efforts should be appreciated because the development and successful implementation of international environmental law is in dire need of leadership, they have raised mounting legitimacy and legality concerns, as exemplified in the 'aviation' case before the Court of Justice of the EU. Dr Morgera will thus explore the extent to which the EU engages in good faith in supporting environmental multilateralism to the benefit of the international community, as opposed to seeking to unduly influence international environmental law purely to its own advantage.

To this end, Dr Morgera will discuss the varied approach taken by EU measures related to climate change, forests and biodiversity, focusing on the Nagoya Protocol on Access to Genetic Resources and Benefitsharing to the Convention on Biological Diversity as a case study.
