

LEADING IN SCIENCE AND INNOVATION



The UK is:

- one of the world's trusted and most innovative countries
- consistently at the forefront of science, culture, finance, politics and more
- the birthplace of many world-changing events, from the Industrial Revolution to the invention of the World Wide Web
- a small country which exerts enormous global influence
- ranked at #1 for the impact of its scientific research
- home to the Russell Group universities renowned for world-leading research.





CAREER PROSPECTS AND EXPERIENCE

- UK graduates are among the most employable in the entire world;
- majority of international students say they progressed more quickly in their career and earn more than their peers who studied elsewhere;
- graduate route: can work in the UK two years after studying









LIVING IN THE UK





ACCOMMODATION



- University accommodation (19% all UK students)
- Own room
- Catered / self-catered
- Common rooms, bars, gyms...
- International halls
- Mixed / single sex
- Rent paid separately to tuition fees
- Private halls luxurious (but expensive!)
- Private / rented accommodation
- Homestays check those registered with British Council



COST OF LIVING



Studying in the UK is good value for money, and average living costs here are lower than in both the USA and Australia.

You can expect to pay:

- £800 £1,300 a month, to cover rent, bills, food and other living costs
- from £10 a month for a mobile phone contract
- around £2.44 for a cup of coffee, from a high street café
- Between £20-40 a month for a gym membership.

Costs differ depending on where you live in the UK.

London and other major cities are more expensive.

£1 = 1.18 Swiss Francs



CHANGES FROM 1 JAN 2021





CHANGES POST-JAN 2021



Arrive in the UK before 1 January 2021

No changes; apply for EU Settlement Scheme to stay longer than 30 June 2021 (if you want to remain in the UK beyond 30 June 2021 and keep 'home fee status' beyond this date)

Arrive in the UK after 1 January 2021 and start your course before 31 July 2021

Changes to immigration status, no changes to fee status

Arrive in the UK after 1 January 2021 and start your course after 1 August 2021

Changes to immigration status and fee status (for studies in England, Scotland and Wales





APPLYING FOR A UK VISA



EU / EEA / Swiss students will need to apply for a visa to come to the UK from 1 January 2021 for > 6 months

- Applications open 5 October 2020.
- Most people can apply via a smartphone app.
- Apply up to six months before course start (after your offer has been confirmed).
- Cost: £348 + Immigration Healthcare Surcharge (for full NHS access)
- Enables you to remain in the UK for up to two years after you have completed your studies (Graduate Route).
- If you're a UK national, from the Republic of Ireland, or you have successfully applied for the 'EU Settlement Scheme', you don't need a visa.

BLENDED LEARNING AND STUDENT WELLBEING



- 97 per cent of universities preparing to deliver some inperson teaching this autumn term.
- Large audience teaching (lectures) will be delivered online, in cases supported by online discussions.
- Face-to-face study in small groups will be made safer through 'bubbles'.
- Courses with practical teaching sessions will be delivered in a safe way with physical distancing and personal protective equipment.
- Many UK institutions developing exciting and innovative examples of high-quality online learning
- A programme of mental health support for students during Covid-19 has been created by Student Minds, the UK's mental health charity for students.
- UK government provided Covid-19 guidance for cleaning of non-healthcare settings, covering student accommodation and other spaces within the community.


