Global Citizenship Education and the Crises of Multiculturalism

This webinar will focus on the crisis of multiculturalism and "living together" in different contexts, and whether global citizenship education is a pertinent concept to address the crisis of multiculturalism. The webinar is based on Drs. Akkari and Maleq's recently published volume, ***Global Citizenship Education Critical and International Perspectives*** (Springer, 2020), which takes a critical and international perspective to global citizenship around the world, addressing a pressing need to provide further conceptual input and open global citizenship agendas to diversity and indigeneity. Speaker: Dr. Abdeljalil Akkari is a professor and the director of the research group on International Education at the University of Geneva, Switzerland. He is also a guest professor at the faculty of International Relations at the Kazakh National University Al-Faraby and regular consultant for UNESCO and other international organizations.



Speaker: Katherine Maleq is a research and teaching fellow at the Faculty of Psychology and Educational Sciences, University of Geneva, Switzerland. Previously she was responsible for the design, coordination, implementation and evaluation of nation-side and regional education for peace programs for an NGO.



Discussant: Sabrina Curtis is a doctoral candidate in the Graduate School of Education and Human Development at the George Washington University. Her research interests include the civic and political experiences of Black youth, community-based education, and the utility of Black feminist and Afrocentric pedagogy in the development of youth's critical civic literacies.
