


Good night, wherever you are around the planet. Welcome to the continuing adventures of World Endangered Writing Day. So one of the really interesting... issues facing any consideration of scripts beyond the mainstream is that they may have a purpose, a usage, a domain, a method of communicating information that is entirely different to what it is that we in the West are used to. It's often called the world's only living pictographic script because the Nazi shamans, known as Dongba, still actively use it for religious rituals, interpreting sacred texts, and preserving history. And the Dongba ancient script was inscribed in the UNESCO memory of the World Register in 2003 as a documentary heritage.

Ce que nous avons appris de nos expériences

- **Un outil puissant pour générer du contenu pédagogique basé sur du texte**
 - Le modèle s'aligne principalement sur le premier niveau de la taxonomie de Bloom, en se concentrant sur l'acquisition de connaissances (connaissances de base).
 - Une intervention humaine est nécessaire lors de la phase de transcription.
- **Limites :**
 - Incapacité à analyser les images d'une vidéo, ce qui limite sa capacité à générer des mots-clés ou des quiz liés aux images.
 - Absence de questions de réflexion et d'analyse (questions ouvertes).
