Role description

Main responsibilities

- Be the focal point for all written translations (English to Arabic and vice versa) at the delegation, in particular reports and general communications to be submitted to the authorities, as well as publications, presentations, training materials, etc.
- Be able to use the appropriate register and style depending on the intended audience of the translated document and taking into consideration local sensibilities and specificities.
- Translate confidential documents and reports produced by the Protection department (in particular for detention-related activities) into Arabic
- Assist the management of the delegation and the Protection coordination team with interpretation during meetings when sensitive / confidential issues are being discussed
- · Assist detention teams during visits conducted in various areas of responsibility in Syria as requested

- Native Arabic speaker with excellent written English & Arabic

- Be comfortable working both independently and as part of a team
- Have previous experience of managing a team
