The Center develops systematic research to catalyze innovation, grows learning-based partnerships (including between the private and public sectors), and disseminates ideas to create impact and address the SDGs. In 2022, researchers at the center published in top academic journals and contributed to applied research through the publication of four white paper studies on topics such as AI adoption in the UN and partnerships for sustainability. The Center develops teaching resources through case studies and disseminates the work by hosting events to elevate cross-sector perspectives. This work is increasingly important for connecting the GSEM to the Geneva ecosystem, particularly the UN and non-profit organizations.


