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

In 2023

GFRI ranked #1 in Europe and #18 worldwide for finance research


The Geneva Finance Research Institute (GFRI) raised from the 2nd to the 1st place in Europe and to the 18th place worldwide for research published in the top-tier journals, among almost 150 universities in a new global research ranking.

The Olin Business School CFAR Ranking of financial research provides information about the research output of the different universities, using the number of articles published in top journals that are relevant to the field reported by Business Source Complete and EconLit. The ranking considers articles published only by finance professors, or non-finance professors who have published at least three papers in the top three finance journals (JF, JFE and RFS).

Elective courses

- Any course in the Finance or Law track can be selected as an elective course if not validated before as a track course.
- Elective courses can be taken in the first and the second part of the master.
- Given that 30 credits should be validated per semester, the ideal structure is as follows:
 - First semester : 2 core courses, 2 track courses, 1 elective course
 - Second semester: 2 core courses, 2 track courses, 1 elective course
 - Third semester : 2 core courses, thesis
- Please consult the study plan for a detailed list of elective courses that can be chosen. In case you want to deviate from the above structure, please contact the student counselor to ensure that it is consistent with the study plan.

Special Courses

- **Learning to Teach Finance A and B (6 ECTS)**
 - Objective: Give students the opportunity to develop teaching and research skills
 - Under the close supervision of a professor, students will perform tasks such as
 1. **Tutoring and teaching assistantship:** running exercise sessions and tutorials, marking assignments/essays/project presentation, elaborating education material/ case studies/webinar/ MOOC, external teacher coordination.
 2. **Research assistantship:** research support, data warehousing.
 3. **Event organization:** Active participation in organizing important events including conferences, workshops, seminars.
- You can take either course A (Fall) or B (Spring), not both.

Thesis

- According to the study plan, thesis should be written in the 3rd semester
- Thesis counts for 18 ECTS
- **Two options**
 1. Master thesis (under supervision of a professor)
 2. Internship thesis (as part of an internship, primarily under the supervision of a practitioner)

Objectives of the Master Thesis

- The Master Thesis is the crowning achievement of your masters' studies
- It provides you with the opportunity to showcase your academic maturity
- The objective is to examine that you
 1. have understood and assimilated the content of the courses
 2. are capable of **independently** structuring and writing a research paper

Master Thesis

- If you want to write a thesis with a professor in your third semester, you need to submit the ‘Master Thesis Project Announcement’ through the Master Platform by End of May
 - More information on exact deadline see official documents on GSEM website
- We will organize a separate information session on the master thesis during the Spring semester.

Some advice regarding the thesis

- In case you want to write an “internship thesis”, you need to find your own internship position. Start looking early!!
- Read the financial press (Financial Times, The Economist, Bloomberg, Wall Street Journal, etc.) to get a sense of what are currently “hot” (i.e., important) topics in economics, finance, and wealth management
- Go talk to professors after their lectures in case you are interested in writing a thesis in their area and discuss ideas with them
 - **Do not** ask them for ideas
 - **Do** discuss your own ideas with them and ask them what they think

Internship program

- In the 3rd semester, you have two options for your final thesis:
 - A traditional academic thesis (with a professor)
 - A professional “Internship Thesis” based on a real internship in the finance or asset/wealth management sector (minimum 12 weeks)
- To support this path, GSEM and GFRI have set up a collaboration program with selected companies and institutions who agree to welcome GEMWeM students each year.
- The goal is to give you a chance to:
 - Gain meaningful experience in the field
 - Apply what you've learned in a real-world context
 - Strengthen your professional profile before graduation



Statement on artificial intelligence



The University of Geneva (UNIGE) supports the development and use of **artificial intelligence (AI)**. Above all, it sees it as an opportunity, based on the principle that the risks associated with it can be minimized through a responsible approach. UNIGE is aware that AI is not just a technological change, but is also bringing about major transformations in almost every field. These consequences call for global, interdisciplinary thinking to enable the UNIGE to respond as effectively as possible to these challenges within the framework of its missions.

Generative AI Directive (GSEM)

Summary of most important points

- Applies to all GSEM students and academic work (individual, group, evaluations)
- Fundamental principles:
 - **Transparency:** Declare tools used and their contribution
 - **Academic integrity:** AI supports, not replaces, assessed skills
- Prohibited uses:
 - Entirely AI-generated work without student input
 - Automatic answering of exams or assignments
 - Submitting content without critical review, source checks, and respect for copyright & confidentiality

Generative AI Directive (GSEM)

Summary of most important points

- AI use in evaluations depends on teacher instructions (free, partial, restricted, or forbidden)
- Students must declare:
 - Tools and versions used
 - Prompts/interactions (if requested)
 - AI-generated parts and personal contribution
- Misuse = violation of academic integrity (plagiarism), with sanctions under University of Geneva rules
 - Directive effective 15 September 2025, reviewed annually

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
