Wealth Management is a leading activity of the financial industry in Switzerland and in the world.



# Admission

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A Bachelor's degree from a Swiss university in Economics, Management, Finance, Information Systems, Mathematics, Physics, Engineering.

Another degree or university qualification may be judged equivalent and give access to the Master's program, with or without conditions.

Complementary program (1 year) or co-required can be requested.

No French proficiency test required for non-Francophones.

## APPLICATION DEADLINE

The enrolment procedure starts in JANUARY of each year.

**Applications close on FEBRUARY 28 for all students.**

The first one to the UNIGE Admissions Office
