To prepare future leaders for this complex business environment, the Geneva School of Economics and Management (GSEM) offers a new Master of Science in Responsible Management (MRM). The first student cohort starts in Fall 2021.

The MRM is:

- A full-time 3-semester master program (90 ECTS) in management starting every year in September
- · Taught entirely in English
- A choice between a general responsible management track and a specialization in Sustainable Business and Human Rights – the first program in Europe with such a specialization
- A program designed to bridge academia and practice that includes a mandatory internship, applied research projects, and a guest lecture series





The MRM offers students:

Excellent career opportunities. Students benefit from Geneva's vibrant community of multinational corporations, financial institutions, international organizations, and non-profit organizations. Executives from these organizations provide valuable insights through frequent guest lectures, collaborate with students in study projects, and offer internship, job, and career opportunities.

Purposeful business education. Students have direct access to cutting-edge management knowledge developed by our faculty members as well as other leading scholars in the field. Our faculty offers innovative courses to deepen the understanding of the complex interplay between business and society, including Business and Human Rights, Responsible Management, Innovation & Philanthropy, and Responsible Leadership.

Student-centered learning. Students benefit from small classes, which allow close interaction with fellow students and our accessible faculty members. Our student-centered environment is also reflected in our way of teaching, focusing on discussions, group interaction, and case study work.

An international experience. Students learn in an international environment that supports the development of intercultural skills. The University of Geneva is frequently ranked one of the world's most international universities — considering both students and faculty members.
