A mandatory Welcome and Orientation Session is organized by the International Affairs Office at the beginning of the Semester to guide exchange students through the main administrative matters relating to their stay (residence permit, health insurance, banking, etc...).

For academic purposes the exchange student will be invited to attend a Faculty welcome session.

### 3. Recommended language skills

The main language of instruction is French. Specific courses are given in English (for more details on the language of instruction, please refer to our course catalogue).

Students taking courses in French are expected to have a good command of French (level B2\*).

Mandatory B2 level for Faculty of Psychology and Educational Sciences.

Strongly recommended C1 level for French literature courses in Faculty of Humanities.

Our “École de langue et de civilisation française” offers modules of one or two semesters with credits that can help you improve your French. French level B1 is required.

Improve French skills: - before your exchange – during the semester:

Exchange students can attend a free French support course each semester. The course starts after the beginning of the semester (more information during the orientation session). There are also fee-paying French courses during the summer and winter holidays (see <http://www.unige.ch/lettres/elcf/course/>). Exchange students may benefit from a discount on fees (registration link for discount provided after registration).

Students taking courses in English are expected to have a good command of English (level B2\*).

### 4. Academic Preparation

Before coming to Geneva, students should select the courses they wish to attend using the course catalogue: [www.unige.ch/progcours.html](http://www.unige.ch/progcours.html) or the website of the Faculty/Institute/Department. The yearly course catalogue is published every summer. Autumn Semester applicants must base their course selection on courses from the previous year and adjust later.

- When the name of the course is in French, the course is given in French
- When the name of the course is in English: the course is given in English.
- Courses marked “A” are given during the Autumn Semester.
- Courses marked “P” are given during the Spring (Printemps) Semester.
- Courses marked “AN” are given during the full academic year (Autumn and Spring Semesters).
- At the end of the course description, the level of the course is mentioned (e.g. Master’s level).

Students must fill in a provisional list of courses (study plan) during online registration process. The academic advisors in Geneva may suggest amendments and will validate it (see below 6. Acceptance Process).

#### 4.1. Restrictions

- Students at the Bachelor’s level are not allowed to take courses at Master’s level (there may be exceptions depending on the courses and/or Faculty; the exchange students should consult the detailed guide sent by us after the nomination).
- Courses may be chosen from two different Faculties/Institutes at the most.
- The students have to choose courses mainly in the Faculty/Institute of the agreement.

### 5.2. Online Student registration deadlines and requirements:

Students will receive a personal email requesting them to register online, with the link and an access code to the registration platform.

During online registration, the following documents MUST be uploaded:

- Transcripts of records (copy of the official grades/courses from your university) (PDF format)
- Photo: high quality and respecting the same requirements as for an official ID/passport (JPG format, exact ration 3:4)
- Copy of the data and picture pages of your passport (PDF format)
- For courses in French: test certificate or UNIGE French test result (PDF format)

Reminder: Students must fill in an expected list of courses (provisional study plan) during online registration. Final study plan will be signed by UNIGE student' advisors within the first 2 weeks of the mobility semester.

## 6. Acceptance Process

Applications are sent to Faculties for approval. Academic advisors in Geneva may suggest amendments to the provisional list of courses and will validate it.

Letters of acceptance will be sent on a first come – first served basis

### 7.1. Visa and Residence Permit

Non-EU citizens may require a visa and must contact the nearest Swiss embassy 3 to 5 months before entering Switzerland in order to inquire about the visa procedure.

The visa will allow entry into Switzerland. Students should also request a residence permit from the Geneva Migration Office (OCPM) prior to arrival in Switzerland, by regular mail.

EU and EFTA citizens do not need a visa to enter Switzerland, but like all foreign citizens, they need a residence permit. EU and EFTA citizens apply once arrived in Geneva for a residence permit.

## 7.2. Housing

## 7.3. Cost of living in Geneva

The average cost of living for a student in Geneva is approximately CHF 2,000 per month.

This includes rent (~CHF 500\*), food and basic necessities (~CHF 600), and health insurance (~CHF 100).

\*Housing in student residences.

Students will have to prove financial capacity (statement of account and assets), both for visa and residence permit requests.

## 7.4. Insurance

Health insurance is mandatory in Switzerland (accident and health). Students may request recognition of their private insurance or subscribe to a student insurance plan upon arrival in Switzerland (about CHF 100 per month). European Health Insurance Card is recognized in Switzerland for health and accident insurance.

## 7.5. Termination of Agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.

## 7.6. Transcripts of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at our institution. Transcript will be sent by the Faculties to the student's address in Europe.

## 7.7. Grading system

The University of Geneva uses a grading scale ranging from 0 to 6.00, with 4.00 representing a passing grade. Furthermore, grades are converted into a letter system ranging from A to F (hereafter known as the ECTS scale), in line with one of the objectives of the Bologna reform. This conversion facilitates comparison amongst different European grading scales.

## **7.8. Scholarships**

Unless stated otherwise, eligible students selected for a Swiss-European Mobility Programme exchange at the University of Geneva will receive a scholarship from the University of Geneva. This is contingent upon having a signed valid agreement. The scholarship is given for 5 months (1 semester) or 10 months (2 semesters). Please consult the table on the next page (annex).
