## **DATA PROTECTION**

For data protection reasons, medical certificates should be transmitted directly to the exam service and not to your teacher. If you send a medical certificate to the exam service, you should make sure to give them the following information: your teacher's name, the title of the seminar, and the date of the seminar you missed. Please keep your teachers informed about any medical certificates you send to the exam service.

Students should no longer include their home address or phone number on the first page of their essays. As outlined in the updated [Style Sheet](#), only the following information should be given: (1) the date of submission, (2) the title of your paper, (3) the title of the seminar, (4) the name of the teacher, (5) the semester and year, (6) the module the essay is for, and (7) your name, and student number.
