

IFRS 2022 workshop - instructions for abstract authors

Please submit your abstract by email to Richard.Fish@unige.ch as a Microsoft Word file with IFRS2022 in the email message subject. Abstracts submitted to other meetings in 2022 are acceptable, provided the format guide below is followed. An acknowledgement email will be sent to the submitting author in the days following submission, with an abstract number. Submitting authors will be contacted by email after the abstract review process. Submission and review decision dates will be posted on the workshop website (<https://www.unige.ch/medecine/IFRS2020/>) and communicated by email to previous participants.

Abstract format guide

All text should be in Times New Roman font, 12pt and 1.5 line-spaced. Please refrain from using all caps, underlining, or changing font/font size. Please include the following content (without these section titles):

Title

Authors

Please list authors in the order you want them to appear, as full names, separated with commas, with affiliation(s) as superscript numbers e.g. William S. S. Holmes¹, John H. Watson¹, etc.

Symbols for shared contributions or correspondence e.g. *,# can be used here, and should be in superscript after the affiliation number e.g. William S. S. Holmes^{1*}

Affiliations

Please give affiliation(s) for each author e.g. ¹Department of Criminology, University of Well-known Detectives, London, UK. Shared contributions or correspondence can be detailed at the end of this section e.g. *For correspondence.

Main text

The abstract main text can be a continuous text or structured into sections. The word count limit is 300, including any sub-section titles. Please do not include references in your abstract.

Figures/Tables

Please do not submit figures, tables or graphics with your abstract.
