

MASTER IN INNOVATION, HUMAN DEVELOPMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY – *Dual Master track*

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- **Bachelor degree** in various fields (including social and political sciences, economics, geography and environment, law, information technology, engineering and applied sciences)
- Certificate in English (for non-Native speakers): valid test and minimum scores **TOEFL 92 or IELTS 7.0¹**
- A strong interest in United Nations **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** and in any forms of **innovation** (technical, economic, cultural and social) aiming at reaching the SDGs
- A strong interest in the sustainable development issues related to **contemporary China**
- An experience in working and studying in **intercultural/international contexts**

ENROLMENT PROCESS AND ADMISSION FILE

There are 3 steps for applying:

- First, candidates must apply for enrolment to the Service des admissions of the University of Geneva

- Second, candidates must submit all the documents required by post:

- Third, **candidates must submit their complete application online on the GS3 Faculty's website** <https://www.unige.ch/sciences-societe/futurs-etudiants/admissionmaster/>

For this step, applications must include:

1. Curriculum vitae (1 page A4).
2. Letter of motivation in English (1 page A4), which explains :
 - a. why the candidate wishes to follow this programme;
 - b. how the candidate is interested in the topics covered by Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs); in the processes of social, technical, economical or cultural innovation; and in contemporary China;
 - c. which track the candidate wishes to follow (Single Master or Dual Master)
 - d. which specialization (see [study plan](#)) the candidate wishes to choose and why.
3. Copies of diplomas²
4. Copies of academic transcripts³
5. IELTS or TOEFL test results (except for English native speakers)
6. Video edited by the candidate (**max. 3 min.**), answering the following questions:
 - a. Why have you applied for this Master?
 - b. What makes you a qualified candidate for this Master?
 - c. What do you want to achieve by taking this Master?

The video (MP4 format exclusively) must be sent through an external link (from an exchange file system, eg WeTransfer, Google Drive etc.) which the student will indicate in the application portal. The link needs to be active at least 7 days from the date of the submission of the form

28 February 2019 (midnight CET) for all applicants
