The data set contains all the variables mentioned in the summary codebook plus a number of additional ones which speak for themselves (year, country, etc.). Although largely comparable, there are a few differences between the datasets for the individual countries that should be taken into account in comparative analyses:

Regarding the events that are included:

1. The data set covers the following time periods:

Regarding variables that are included:

- 4. The SSUPPACT/SACSCOP (supported actor) variables have been coded for UK, F and CH, but not in D and NL.
- 5. TITLE (short description of the event) has been coded for:
