Socio Online Rules

Presentation format

- 10 to 20-minute presentation (sharp), followed by 40 minutes of discussion, on Zoom, in English or French
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During the presentation

- Participants connect on Zoom at 12 noon, one participant volunteers to do the time-keeping
 - Presentation starts at 12:05 sharp and ends maximum at 12:25, followed by 40-minute discussion (ending at maximum 13:05)
 - Participants raise their hands on Zoom to intervene during the discussion (by clicking the "reactions" button), the speaker does the moderation
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Attendance

- Speakers are expected to attend all presentations and are allowed to skip a limited number of presentations (which will be informed by the coordinators before the start of the presentation cycle) which are noted on Doodle
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Abstracts

- Presentation abstracts (maximum 300 words) will be posted on the UNIGE Sociology website to enhance the visibility of your research and Socio Online. Abstract publication is not compulsory and up to the speaker
 - Please send your abstract to the coordinators one week after your presentation the latest
 - Socio Online speakers will "peer-reviewed" each others' abstracts, to guarantee the abstracts' quality. When they receive an abstract "for review", speakers should review it and reply to the coordinators within 2 weeks
