HIGHLIGHTS

I study work and everyday life as a source of inequality, especially among young people. I analyzed issues related to psychological health, life trajectories and careers using my main theoretical and methodological expertise: social capital theory and social network analysis. I worked on integrating life course and social network research co-editing the special issue *Networked Lives* for *Advances in Life Course Research*. I am leading the project *The Empty Office*, a study on the effects of telework on wellbeing. Since 2023, I am qualified as an associate professor by the AQU agency.

My work has been published in *Computers in Human Behaviour*, *Advances in Life Course Research*, *Social Indicators Research*, *Journal for the Theory of Social Behavior*, *Sociological Research Online*, *PLoS ONE*, *Community, Work & Family* and other peer-reviewed international journals.
