Your missions

Support and accompany one or several first-year students throughout an entire year in order to help them **find their feet** at UNIGE and foster their **social and academic integration**.

To help your mentees **settle in**, you can:

- * actively take part in the Welcome Days week from September 7th to 11th, 2026. Faculty-specific Campus Guide meetings will be held.



The rest of the Welcome Days programme is optional but we highly recommend you share these moments with your group (tours, Q&A, etc.)

To support the **academic integration** of your mentees, help them:

- * understand the professors' expectations and course objectives,
- * respect deadlines and follow administrative procedures related to their studies (registration to courses and exams, contact persons, available services, etc.),
- * adopt effective study methods for time management, note-taking, revision, and exam preparation.

To support the **social integration** of your mentees, help them:

- * build connections with other students (social gatherings, student unions, events, etc.),
- * discover and take part in the university's activities (sports, cultural events, etc.),
- * integrate into the Geneva life (cultural and sports events, outings, etc.).

- * Organise at least three meetings with your mentees (IRL or online)
- * Support and advise your mentees throughout the academic year

- * Take part in the evaluation of the programme
