Call for Papers V Geneva Graduate Conference in Political Philosophy

The *GECOPOL_Graduate* will take place on 15-16 February 2024. A full in-presence conference, with keynote lectures live-streamed.

The conference is a forum for PhD students to present their works in progress, receive constructive feedback in a supportive atmosphere, and exchange ideas both with peers and with leading academics in the field of political philosophy worldwide.

PhD students may express their interest in presenting papers at the *GECOPOL_Graduate* by sending an **extended abstract** of their intended contribution (max 1500 words – in **English**) accompanied by a **short abstract** (max 200 words – in **English**) and a **curriculum vitae**, by **5 November 2023**. **Conference attendance is free of charge** and open to anyone upon registration. Accepted participants are responsible for seeking funds to cover their expenses. Details about the conference programme and other arrangements regarding the onsite logistics to follow. The working language of the *GECOPOL_Graduate* is English.
